rescued 2 cold-stressed manatees from our
waters with the help of FWC, SeaWorld
Orlando, USFWS, and ADCNR. The manatees,
named OWA and Mardis Gras, were treated at
SeaWorld's critical care facility and released in
Crystal River, FL. Members of our staff
participated in Owa's release in early April!
