We hope you will join our team for Coastsal Clean up 2012.



RESEARCH HIGHLIGHT

You have likely heard the phrase, "you are what you eat". This concept can be used to identify the foods that manatees eat.

For the past 5 years, MSN researchers have collected data on the chemical signatures (stable isotope ratios) in tissues of manatees captured or that died in Alabama & Mississippi. Skin, muscle, & ear bones have been used to identify the vegetation that supports local manatee populations & trace their position in local food webs.

Thanks to generous support from US Fish & Wildlife Service and Save the Manatee Club, MSN now has manatee awareness signage available for the northern Gulf of Mexico.

Signs are FREE to waterfront property owners in Alabama & Mississippi. They mount easily to pilings and the bright colors alert boaters that manatees are seen in the area.

Matching boat decals provide a quick reference to report manatee sightings on the water.

The program, which began in July, is extremely successful. More than 80 signs have been distributed.
