Hello, and Welcome!

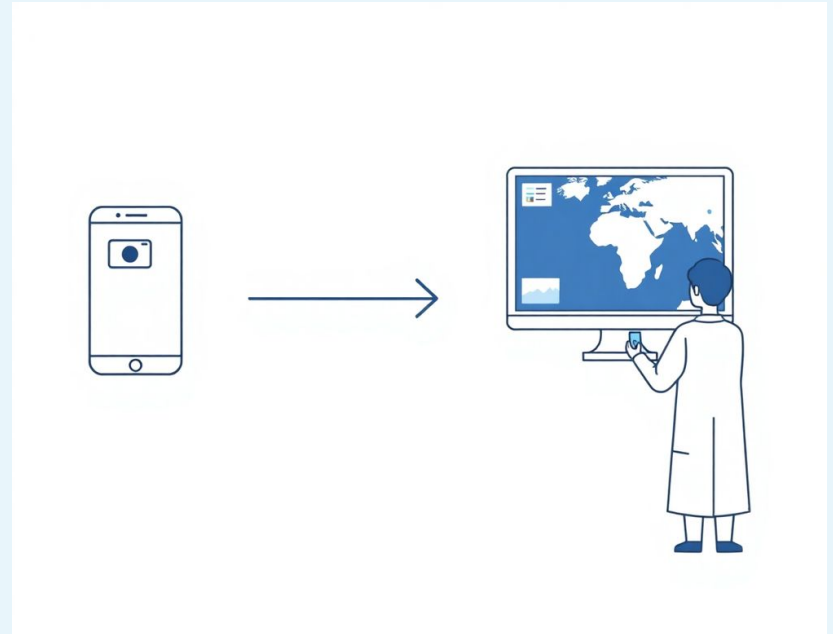

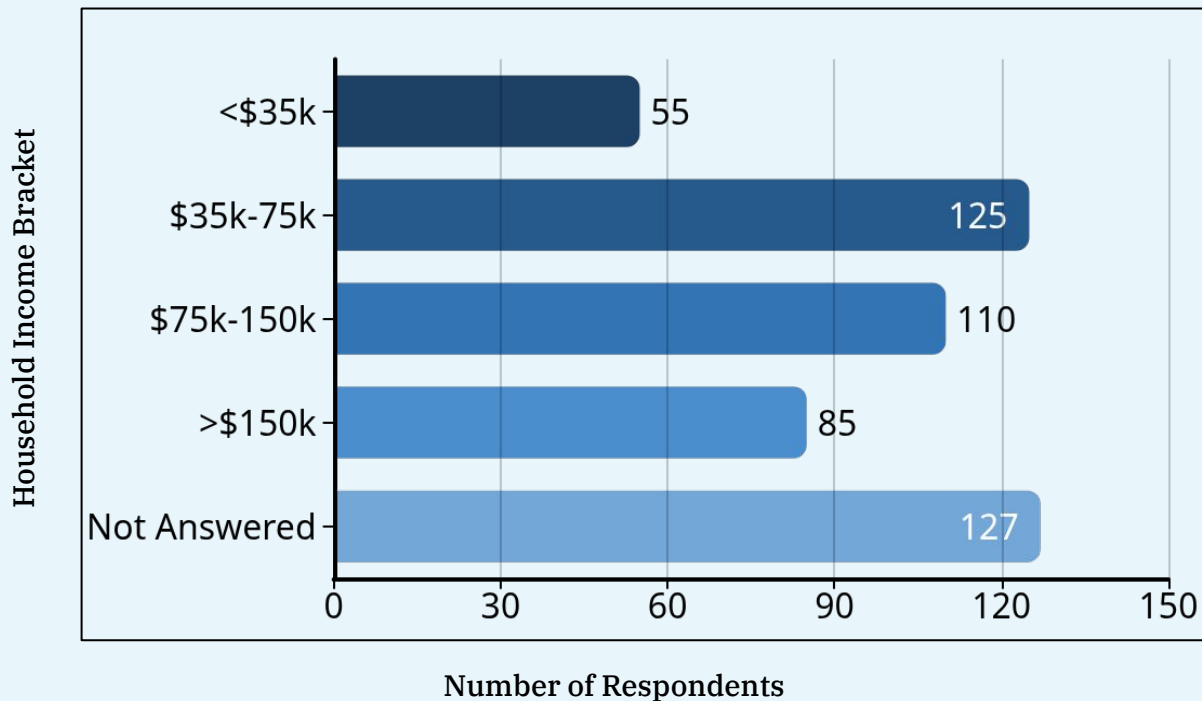
How Would It Work?

What Does This All Mean? Our Key Takeaways



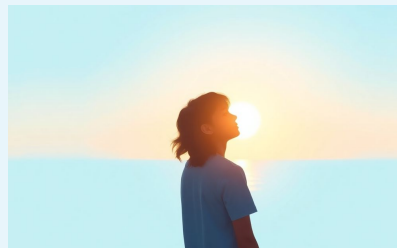
There's Strong Overall Support

Younger residents (18-30) showed the greatest enthusiasm. They are a key audience for future recruitment and engagement efforts.



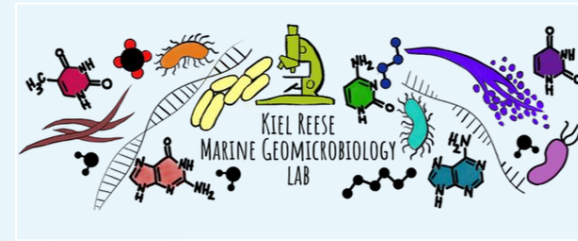
Broad Appeal Across Demographics
